Dear Parents and Guardians:

I would like to provide you with some information pertaining to the review of the Queen Elizabeth Regional High School system. A meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Newfoundland and Labrador English School District occurred on Tuesday, April 4, 2017 where trustees passed motions regarding the system.

The motions passed will result in the following changes for the 2017-2018 school year:

- Reduced student attendance zones for Upper Gullies Elementary and St. Edward's Elementary.
- The areas removed from the student attendance zones of these schools will be included in the attendance zone for the new school.
- The new school will be constituted as a Kindergarten to Grade 6 school for the 2017-2018 school year and in the 2018-2019 school year and thereafter be a Kindergarten to Grade 7 school.

This was Scenario A of the District information package, which was distributed to the school communities during the consultation process and is available here:

As some students of both Upper Gullies Elementary and St. Edward's Elementary will be attending the new school next year, families are advised to review this material and the attendance zones. If you have questions about this, you should contact your school administration.

In the coming days transitions teams will be established consisting of the school administrations and District staff, and include consultation with and input from the school councils. Information on the opening of the new school, as well as relevant information about the reconfigurations, attendance zones, and busing information for the coming school year, will be provided to the school communities in the coming weeks.
